

THE HATCHERY: TURTLE CONSERVATION EXPERIENCE

The annual hatching of turtles at World Science Festival Brisbane is one of our most popular activities, providing a rare opportunity to experience nature's miracle up close and personal.

Designed in collaboration with internationally renowned herpetologist Colin Limpus, this extraordinary conservation initiative follows the initial stages of life, from incubation to hatching live at the Festival.

The new born turtles will then be transported to the Sunshine Coast and released 20km off shore along with other hatchlings fitted with transmitters to help track their early life movements.


