World Science Festival Brisbane and Curiocity Brisbane ready to roll for 2024

After five days of thought-provoking talks, more than 130 engaging events, turtle hatchlings and cutting-edge science discoveries and demonstrations, **World Science Festival Brisbane** has wrapped up for 2023.

Engaging the minds and hearts of visitors across Brisbane's Cultural Precinct and South Bank, the festival drew crowds from around the world including science enthusiasts, students, and families.

Attendees together with some of the most prominent scientists, thinkers, and industry leaders, explored the latest developments in STEM – from the new space travel expeditions planned in the next 10 years, to stories rewriting the origin of humankind.

The festival kicked off with The Future of Space Exploration, a signature conversation direct from New York featuring festival co-founder Professor Brian Greene, NASA's chief scientist and representatives from space agencies around the globe.

Throughout World Science Festival Brisbane, visitors were able to get their science fix taking in a range of topics including climate change, space exploration, quantum computing, genetics, and more.

Panel discussions featured international and local luminaries including paleoanthropologist Lee Berger, neuroscientist Veronica O'Keane, Palaeontologist Ignacio Escapa from Argentina, and NASA's Exoplanet Archive Task Scientist, Australian-born Jessie L. Christiansen.

Minister for the Arts Leeanne Enoch said once again World Science Festival Brisbane has been incredibly successful, delivering amazing attendance numbers and on-line visitors who engaged with art-infused scientific wonders and dinosaur sized events and exhibitions.

"This year's festival showcased the sold-out Turtle Hatchery, Queensland's first scientists and the traditional cultural knowledge of our First Nations Peoples," Minister Enoch said.

"It also featured the return of international speakers including Professor Brian Green along with cofounder Tracey Day of the World Science Festival.

"I am pleased to announce The World Science Festival Brisbane will return next year from 20-24 March 2024, with Curiocity Brisbane from 20-31 March 2024.

"The Queensland Government supports the Queensland Museum to present signature events like the World Science Festival Brisbane, to profile Queensland as an international destination for artistic innovation and scientific breakthroughs on our path towards 2032 Brisbane Olympic and Paralympic Games."

The Hatchery once again proved to be the highlight of the festival, selling out within 24 hours, while family-friendly events including City of Science, pop-up science shows, film screenings and musical performances attracted thousands of visitors across the weekend.

Queensland Museum Network CEO Dr Jim Thompson said seeing another successful festival is a proud achievement and that festival programming continues to develop and offer new perspectives on our world.

"World Science Festival Brisbane continues to grow in popularity and has become a hub for scientific discovery and exploration," Dr Thompson said.

"We hope that our participants and visitors have a renewed sense of curiosity and excitement for the possibilities of science.

"We now look forward to taking the festival on the road for World Science Festival Queensland, which lands in Toowoomba on Sunday 21 May."

World Science Festival Co-Founders Professor Brian Greene and Tracy Day said it was an absolute joy to return to Brisbane for the first time since 2019.

"It has been an amazing experience returning to Brisbane and heart-warming to see festival fans attending incredible science and arts events over across this amazing city," Ms Day said.

"Coming to Brisbane is always a highlight of my year and we've missed the enthusiasm and excitement since our last trip in 2019. Brisbane has embraced this festival, which we established to inspire audiences."

Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner said the festival was a great opportunity for Brisbane to inspire the community and showcase its strengths in innovation, art and science.

"Over five brilliant days, World Science Festival filled the hearts and minds of thousands of curious locals and visitors, as they discovered something new in the cultural heart of Brisbane," Cr Schrinner said.

"The event is a popular fixture on Brisbane's jam-packed major events calendar, which inject millions into our economy and supports local jobs."

Creators and makers, artists, engineers, and architects from around the world are now invited to submit an idea for a large scale physical or digital installation via an **online Expression of Interest** on the website to be considered as part of *Curiocity Brisbane* 2024.

World Science Festival Queensland events will be held at Toowoomba, Chinchilla, Townsville, Gladstone, and Ipswich later this year.

The festival will return in 2024, with new ideas, discoveries, and insights to share.
